Mayor Bernie, as he is affectionately known in Slocan, has been a presence in our community since the early 1970's. In 1972. he and his son opened Bernie's Garage, where Mountain Valley Station is today.

Bernie entered Village politics in 1984, when he became an alderman. By that end of that year, he had assumed the Mayor's chair. He would serve as mayor from December 1984—December 1988 and then again from December 1991 to December 1996.

During his first term on Council, Bernie built three footbridges (himself!) and received an Expo
