VILLAGE OF SLOCAN MEETING NOTES: March 11th, 2013

- The Columbia Basin Trust Community Initiatives and Affected Areas Programs (CIP/AAP) public input meetings on the applications will be held April 8, 2013, at 5:00 p.m. at the Village Office.
- Council agreed to amend Village of Slocan Employment Policy #2008-003, to include three (3) days paid leave provisions for employees to deal with compassion care issues, medical issues, or family issues without loss of pay.
- Council agreed to contribute \$315.00 towards the Silverton electronic recycling program. The program is
 available to Village residents. Staff is to talk to the Village of Silverton about Slocan including electronic
 materials in the annual clean-up week and taking them to Silverton.
- In response to correspondence from MP Alex Atamanenko, of a recent Canada Post decision to review every post office across Canada in an effort to move toward a 'new smaller retail model', Village Council adopted a motion to write a letter to Steven Fletcher, the Minister responsible for Canada Post, and ask that he instruct Canada Post to keep the public post office in Slocan open and consult with the public, their elected representatives, postal unions and other major stakeholders to dramatically improve the Canadian Postal Service Charter, including developing a better process for making changes to the retail and delivery network.
- In response to a letter from Michelle Morelli concerning the Library, Mayor Perriere is to provide a written response.
- Council agreed to invite representatives from SLSS to attend the April 8th regular meeting. The
 presentation would cover the results of the Imagine Project.
- Council appointed Councillor Lunn as the Village of Slocan representative to the Slocan District Chamber of Commerce.
- Council considered a March 7th request from the Slocan District Chamber of Commerce updating the Village on their activities and requesting a grant of 80% of business license fees collected. Council referred the grant request from the Slocan District Chamber of Commerce to the April 8th meeting.
- Mayor Perriere reported that Megan Bly is leaving the Fitness Centre. A letter of thanks is to be sent to Megan for her efforts and commitment to the Fitness Centre.
- Councillor Lunn will host a Tourism Committee meeting on March 20th at 6:30 p.m. in the Village Office.
 All interested people are invited to attend.
- Council adopted a motion dissolving the Library Committee and appointed Joanne Ellis to investigate the
 creation of a new structure by which to manage the Library. A letter of thanks to be forwarded to the
 Library Committee volunteers.
- Council agreed to send a letter of thanks to Tom Krznaric for his efforts at the Curling Rink this year.
- Staff is to arrange a meeting with Ralph Tomlin, Tim Hill and John Van Bynen to discuss boat access and parking concerns.
- Council approved Concession Stand Inspection Policy 2013-13.


- Tune into local radio stations for evacuation alerts and sand bag locations
