course on forestry, which will very likely lead immediately to a local job. The course is being offered in Slocan from January 5th to February 6th.

Participants who show up every day on time will be paid \$250 a week to attend.

Participants will receive several certificates that will help them find work, including Occupational First Aid Level 1, WHMIS, Tree ID, Bear Aware, ATV Training, Transportation Endorsement, and more.

At the end of the training, participants will be able to carry out entry-level jobs on wildfire interface and trail building projects, suppression crews, and right-of-way vegetation management.

The course is also being offered in Nelson from January 26 to February 27 and in Salmo from January 26 to February 27.
