

SLOCAN WATER PLANT

On September 7th, 2013 the Village of Slocan issued a 'Do Not Use Water' notice due to a minor mudslide in the Village's water supply at Gwillam Creek. Our Public Works Crew were forced to shut the water plant down until the situation could be assessed. Office staff notified all users on the water system and residents were asked to conserve water. By September 8th, the creek had flushed itself out enough to restart the plant. Crews monitored the system over the course of the weekend and into the week, and the 'Do Not Use Water' notice was lifted Monday, September 9th, 2013.

Currently, the reservoir is back at full capacity and the creek is running clear. We thank you for your cooperation.

VILLAGE OF SLOCAN MEETING NOTES: September 9th, 2013

- Carol Barclay attended the meeting to discuss a July 8/13 Council decision denying her request to rezone her Harold Street property from commercial to residential. Council's decision denying the request was based on a previous Council decision not to permit a similar request to proceed. Ms. Barclay requested Council to reconsider their July 8/13 decision.
- The Fall Clean up Week will be held October 21st to October 24th. As in 2012, collections will be limited to organic material only.
- A September 3/13 report from the CAO on the concerns being raised about the terms of offer in the Stewardship
 Plan for Packaging and Printed Paper from Multi-Material BC (MMBC). MMBC is the new agency set up by BC
 industry to meet the Extended Producer Responsibility requirements introduced under BC's Recycling Regulation.
 Council's position on paper and packaging collection services will remain status quo, without Multi-Material BC
 involvement. Council's position is subject a RDCK decision on providing regional paper and packaging collection
 service.
- Correspondence from Theresa DesCamp of the Slocan Lake Stewardship Society requesting letters of support for
 two grant proposals that are being submitted by the SLSS. The first is a capacity building proposal to Mountain
 Equipment Co-op to replace worn and dysfunctional water testing equipment; develop a training protocol for the
 use of this equipment; train volunteer teams in each of the villages; and to develop a fund to support water testing.
 The second grant will be submitted to the Real Estate Foundation proposing to hire someone to develop a
 interactive program on the activities of the SLSS. Council agreed to provide letters of support to Slocan Lake
 Stewardship Society grant applications to Mountain Equipment Co-op and to the Real Estate Foundation.
- Council agreed that the Village of Slocan will contribute \$25.00 towards the first 10 Slocan residents that join the FortisBC Kootenay Energy Diet in Slocan.
- A September 3rd report from Michelle Gordon, Administrative Assistant highlighting the Municipal Administration Training Institute Foundations Program she attended August 11 16.
- The CAO reported on the Gwillam Creek mud slide that resulted in the shutting down of the treatment plant on September 7/13. The water treatment plant is now functioning and the storage tank is full.
- Council requested staff prepare a draft Social Media Policy and to investigate the creation of an 'official Village of Slocan facebook page'.

The Village of Slocan will only pick up organic materials. All other materials will be left and it will be the owner's responsibility to take to the appropriate recycling facility or transfer station.

Residents are requested to place any organic materials for pickup on the boulevard where you would normally place your garbage can. Any items placed on the boulevard after October 24th will not be removed and the home owner will be responsible for disposing of the materials.
