VILLAGE OF SLOCAN MEETING NOTES: August 14th and 21st, 2017

AUGUST 14TH - SPECIAL MEETING

Robert Inwood, Heritage Design Engineer, attended the meeting to present to Council, the Heritage Design Plan for the Legion hall.

AUGUST 14TH - REGULAR MEETING

- Patricia Dehnel, Community Relations Manager/Senior Energy Specialist for the CEA, presented a proposal: Laying the Groundwork for Transition 2050 Project - Expanding FCM PCP Membership in the Kootenays.
- Shauna Fidler of the West Kootenay Permaculture Co-op, presented a proposal to Council regarding support/grant sponsorship for a mobile food education project in the Slocan Valley.
- Dick Kelly of the Spirit of Slocan Committee, presented details of the Slocan Cenotaph Project.
- Council will table a decision on requests coming forward regarding the Transition 2050 Project, Mobile Food Education Project, and Cenotaph Project, and that a Special Meeting be held on August 21, 2017 at 1pm.
- Council will schedule appointments at the 2017 UBCM Convention with the Minister of Energy Mines & Petroleum Resources to discuss the Hydro Project, Minister of Municipal Affairs & Housing to discuss the Seniors Housing Project, Minister of Public Safety & Solicitor General to discuss the 2015 Degroot incident, Minister of Children & Family Development to discuss children/programs in BC, and Premier Horgan to discuss current projects in Slocan/community in transition. Council has requested to join New Denver Councillors when meeting with the Minister of Health, to discuss physician recruitment and health care in the Slocan Valley.
- Council approved a number of requests coming forward from the Spirit of Committee, for their upcoming Family Fun Day on September 3rd. Mayor and Council will attend, and the old fire truck will be included in the parade.
- The Quarterly Financial Report ending June 30th, 2017 was received.
- The Village of Slocan Zoning Amendment Bylaw No. ____, 2017 was adopted and numbered 657. The Village of Slocan OCP Amendment Bylaw No. ____, 2017 was adopted and numbered 658.

AUGUST 21ST - SPECIAL MEETING

- Council approved the request to become a member of FCM's Partner for Climate Protection.
- Council tabled a decision on the Cenotaph Project tree removal request until the next meeting.
- The Village will sponsor the West Kootenay Permaculture Co-op's grant application to the Community Food Center Canada's Child & Youth Innovation Program.

NOTICE OF 2017 TAX SALE

Pursuant to Part 11 of the Local Government Act,

the properties will be listed and sold in the public auction. All properties with delinquent balances will be advertised in advance of the tax sale.

RAIN BARREL INITIATIVE

In 2016, the Village put a call out to residents who would be interested in obtaining a rain barrel for their home/yard. Rain barrels are becoming a popular household item as people start to consider water conservation and local food production. The Coca-Cola Company has started to repurpose their syrup barrels and turn them into rain barrels. The Village has been in contact with Coca-Cola and were able to retain 100 rain barrels for this initiative - 50 were offered to the Village of Silverton and 50 reserved for this project in our community. Each barrel has been shipped with a corresponding spigot kit.

At this time, we are looking for volunteers to assist the Village in hosting a water conservation recognition event, and complete installation of the spigots. Each conversion requires a drill and is estimated to take approximately 10 minutes for installation.




