Residential Fall Cleanup 2017

Monday, Oct. 16th - Thursday, Oct. 19th

Acceptable Items:

- Tree Trimmings / Branches (under 10cm in diameter and 3 meters in length, bundled neatly)
- √ Leaves (bagged)
- Organic Materials

The Village of Slocan will only pick up organic materials. All other materials will be left and it will be the owner's responsibility to take to the appropriate recycling facility or transfer station.

Residents are requested to place any organic materials for pickup on the boulevard where you would normally place your garbage can. Any items placed on the boulevard after October 19th will not be removed and the home owner will be responsible for disposing of the materials.

FREE VEHICLE REMOVAL

The week of October 16th, the Village will once again be offering <u>FREE</u> vehicle removal. If you are interested in participating, please contact the Village Office to register. We will require the make, model, colour and license plate # of your vehicle (unlicensed vehicles will also be accepted). Please remember to move your vehicle onto the Village Boulevard on your scheduled day of pick-up.

This program was initiated in response to Village beautification and in preparation for winter snowclearing.

There is no cost to the Village or residents for this service.

VILLAGE OF SLOCAN MEETING NOTES – September 11th, 2017

- Colin Moss, Slocan Valley Health Committee, and Isaac Carter, ICandyFilms, gave a presentation to Council regarding creation of a promotional film focusing on physician recruitment and promotion of the Slocan Valley. Council awarded a \$1,000 Community Development Grant to support the project.
- Fall Clean-Up Week will be held October 16 October 19, 2017 and that collections be limited to organic material only (yard and garden waste). The Village will also be offering free vehicle removal.
- Council approved a \$750 Community Development Grant to the 27th Annual Halloween Hoot.
- Council supported the 2018 Unity Music Festival in principle, and directed staff complete Part E of their Canadian Heritage Grant Application, showing the Village's in-kind contributions to the event, as requested. Festival organizers have been asked to coordinate with staff and Council to discuss the event details, closer to the date.
- Council approved the Slocan Valley Seniors' Housing Society's proposed Development Permit Plan Amendment.
- Council approved the Spirit of Slocan Committee's request to remove the cedar trees and stumps from the north-west corner of the Wellness Center Property, to accommodate the newly-proposed landscape plan for the Cenotaph Project.
- Council will provide a letter of support to the Slocan Lake Stewardship Society, supporting their
 application to MFLNRO for an "Application Only Area" status on a parcel of Crown Land at the mouth of
 Shannon Creek.
- Moved out of In-Camera to open meeting: Council approved the Slocan Valley Seniors' Housing Society's long-term ground lease, as presented.

SNOW REMOVAL

Winter is coming and the Village of Slocan would like to remind residents to keep boulevards clear of unlicensed vehicles and debris, in preparation for snow removal. Clearance of Village road right-of-ways and boulevards should be done prior to Oct. 31, 2017 and is pursuant to the Slocan Traffic & Highways Regulation Bylaw No. 452. Persons with disabilities and seniors may apply for **clearance of driveway furrows** at the Village Office. Proof of eligibility is required for new applicants – recurring applicants can re-register over the phone.


