VILLAGE OF SLOCAN MEETING NOTES – February 13, 2018

- Members of Council, as available, will attend the AKBLG (Association of Kootenay Boundary Local Governments) AGM & Annual Conference in Fernie, BC from April 17 – 20, 2018.
- The CIP/AAP CBT Community Initiatives Public Input Meeting has been scheduled for MONDAY, APRIL 23 AT 5PM, at which time applicants will be invited to give a 5-minute presentation and answer any questions on their applications. Council will deliberate the allocation of funds at a special meeting on April 30th at 5pm.
- In an effort to mitigate risk from wildfire in the Village and surrounding areas, Slocan will submit an application for funding to the Strategic Wildfire Prevention Initiative and Columbia Basin Trust, in partnership with SIFCo. The proposed treatment area map can be viewed at the Village Office.
- The Village will support a joint application to the UBCM under the Emergency Operations Center & Training Program stream of the Community Emergency Preparedness Fund in partnership with the RDCK and participating municipalities.
- The Village will support a joint application to the UBCM Strategic Wildfire Prevention Initiative Program
 and to CBT's Wildfire Mitigation Program, in partnership with the RDCK and participating municipalities,
 to fund a Fire Smart Program in the region.
- Council received an Asset Management Project progress report, prepared by LandInfo Technologies Inc.
 The final report will be presented to Council at the March meeting.
- Council approved the extension request received from the Slocan Legion, for their CIP/AAP-funded project: Kitchen Exhaust System/Kitchen Reno.
- Council will provide a \$400 sponsorship to the 2018 BC Seniors Games, from the RDCK Grant Fund.
- A letter will be sent to Claire Peyton of Silverton, to accompany her application to nominate Donna Gibbons, Nurse Practitioner, for the *Health Care Hero Award*, expressing how Donna has helped our community.
- Staff will revisit looking into a boat wash station for the beach, to assist with deterring the spread of invasive mussels into BC waters.
- Staff will investigate the 2016 Census Population and Dwelling Counts returned after challenging the 2016 data, and pressure Statistics Canada for more accurate numbers for Slocan.
- A letter of support will be sent to the Slocan District Chamber of Commerce, supporting the Arrow Slocan Tourism Association's application to the Province to collect the MRDT (2% hotel tax) within the Villages of Slocan, Nakusp, New Denver, Silverton, and Areas H and K of the RDCK, for a five-year term.
- Council re-appointed Mike Koolen to the RDCK Rosebery Parklands & Trails Commission as the Slocan representative, for the 2018-2020 term.



After signing on to the Climate Action Charter in 2008, the Village completed a carbon inventory and now tracks and reports its GHG emissions annually. In 2016, a Community Energy & Emissions Plan (SCEEP) was completed, and Slocan has recently become a Partner for Climate Protection through FCM's PCP Transition 2050 Program. Slocan has been recognized in November 2017 for becoming the first 100% Renewable Kootenay's Community - the 5° municipality in all of Canada with a goal to become 100% renewable by 2050.
