

Village of Slocan partners with CKISS to map invasive plants

Thanks to a Columbia Basin Trust grant awarded to the Village of Slocan, the Central Kootenay Invasive Species Society (CKISS) will be completing an inventory of priority invasive plants within the Village of Slocan this summer. The information will be used to plan future management activities and support the Village in their efforts to prevent and reduce the impacts of invasive species on their jurisdiction.

Invasive species are recognized globally as one of the greatest threats to native biodiversity, and can have negative impacts on human and livestock health, wildlife habitat, and the regional economy. In particular, knotweeds are considered the highest priority invasive plant in all of British Columbia, and are listed by the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) as one of the world's "100 Worst" invasive species.

Some of the priority species that will be mapped include knotweeds, Scotch broom, hoary alyssum, and Himalayan blackberry.

If you see a team of CKISS technicians working around the village with hi-vis vests and tablets, taking photos and collecting data, you will know what they are up to! You may also see the CKISS booth set up at the boat launch this summer, providing information to boaters on aquatic invasive species risks and prevention tips. 

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VILLAGE OF SLOCAN MEETING NOTES – April 12, 2021

- Michael Zimmer, Okanagan Nation Alliance (ONA), presented to Council on the Springer Creek Fish Habitat Assessment Proposal, and provided an update on the progress of Salmon reintroduction. A letter will be sent to the Okanagan Nation Alliance, in support of their application to the FWCP First Nations Directed grant funding stream, for completion of baseline data on Springer Creek.
- Council resolved to increase the municipal tax rate for 2021 by 3%, and staff were directed to prepare the 2021 Tax Rate Bylaw. Council has applied a 3% increase historically each year, and in 2020 no increase was implemented due to COVID-19. Increasing the tax rate by 3% for the 2021 billing cycle will reflect an increase of approximately \$20 on the average assessed home value of \$196,000.
- A meeting has been scheduled for Monday, April 26th, 2021 at 7:00pm for presentation of the budget, and first readings of the Financial Plan Bylaw and Tax Rate Bylaw.
- Council will proceed with allocating \$188,200 from the Gas Tax Reserve Fund to the 2021 budget, to complete resurfacing of Main Street and the boat launch turnaround.
- The results of the Affordable Housing Project Public Opinion Survey were received. The results have been posted to the Village website, Affordable Housing page.
- The Village agree to be a sponsor for the Slocan Valley Heritage Trail Society's \$5,000 project and application to the Slocan Valley Legacy Fund, for equipment attachments and accessories.
- A letter was received from Kaylee Greig, requesting support for an Earth Day garbage clean-up event. Council approved to support the efforts by offering disposal of the garbage bags from the event.
- A letter will be sent to Katrine Conroy, Minister of Forests, Lands Natural Resource Operations & Rural Development, supporting the District of Sicamous' resolution regarding Aquatic Invasive Species enforcement.
- Council will promote Elections BC's "List of Future Voters" initiative amongst Slocan Valley schools.

If you qualify for the home owner grant, you must apply each year to receive it. You must apply every year because the previous year's information may be out of date if your residential circumstance has changed. This may affect your qualifications for the grant.

Starting in 2021, residents in municipalities no longer apply for the home owner grant through their municipal office. Everyone now applies directly to the province using a new online system that's easy to use and will process applications faster. When you apply, we'll need your social insurance number to verify your eligibility.

Get ready to apply:

- 1. Wait to receive your property tax notice in the mail. This usually happens around May.
- 2. Keep your property tax notice on hand. It has important numbers you'll need to apply.
- apply online. It only takes a few minutes and is faster than calling.
- 4. If you're unable to apply online, call us at 1-888-355-2700 for assistance.

Apply for the home owner grant when you receive your property tax notice. You may apply early, but applications are processed after tax notices are mailed out.

*Be sure to apply before your property tax due date to avoid late payment penalties.
