APPLICATION FOR PATRON PARTICIPATION ENDORSEMENT

The Lobby Grill, located on the ground floor of the Slocan Hotel, at 501 Harold Street in the Village of Slocan, has applied for a Patron Participation Entertainment Endorsement on their existing Food Primary Liquor Licence.

Food Primary Liquor Licenses regulated by the Liquor & Cannabis Regulation Branch currently do not allow for patron participation without the endorsement - which is described as any form of entertainment that entails the active involvement of patrons or results in patrons leaving their seats, including but not limited to: sing-along, karaoke, dancing, or performance.

As part of the application process, the Licensing Branch is seeking approval from the Village of Slocan. Prior to considering approval of this licence amendment application, Slocan Council wishes to seek comments from the public. Feedback can include impact on your residence or the community as a whole.

Details of the licence application are available for review at the Village Office during regular business hours. Anyone wishing to comment on this application must do so in writing by 4pm on Wednesday, APRIL 3rd, 2024 to appear on the agenda of Council. Comments must be in writing to be accepted. Unsigned submissions will be rejected.

Council will consider this application at its Regular Meeting of April 8th, 2024 at 7:00pm.

W.E. Graham **Community School**


There are many options for parents in the Slocan Valley for schooling. So, we want to tell you about our school.



VILLAGE OF SLOCAN MEETING NOTES

February 12, 2024 - Regular Meeting

- Council will attend the Association of Kootenay Boundary Local Gov'ts Annual Conference on April 19-21, in Kimberley.
- The ReDi Grant Public Input Meeting will be held on April 15th at 5pm. Deliberations will take place on April 22nd at 6pm.
- Council will contribute \$3,000 from the RDCK Community Development Fund, to the Office Backup Generator Project.
- Council awarded \$150 from the RDCK Discretionary Grant Fund to the 2024 Easter Egg Hunt.
- Council approved, in principle, the request from the Slocan Valley Historical Society, to investigate installing a heat pump in the upper level of the Village Officer for the archives.
- Council will set aside \$379 from the RDCK Discretionary Grant Fund, to participate in the Sue Big Oil campaign, representing \$1 for every Slocan resident.
- Staff will contact the Central Kootenay Invasive Species Society to promote and encourage invasive mussel education and awareness in Slocan.
- Staff were directed to investigate a privacy fence for site #21 in the campground, where trees along Giffin Ave were removed.
- The Village will investigate potential sites for an Okanagan Nation Alliance's "Hatchery in a Box" Program.

March 11, 2024 - Regular Meeting

- The Patron Participation Endorsement Application for the Lobby Grill was received. The public may submit written comment on the application prior to April 8th.
- Council approved the request from Treehugger Retreats & Events, to host Harmony Festival on the beach on July 20th and 21st.
- Council approved the request from Christina Knight, to host the Saturday Market at Expo Park during the summer. Council awarded \$2,000 from the RDCK Community Development Fund in support of the event.
- · Council gave first three readings to the "Village of Slocan Growing Communities Reserve Fund Bylaw".
- Council approved the request to consider amending the Zoning Bylaw to allow for long-term residential use at 801 Harold Street, for the survival of the existing structure or until ownership changes, with the following conditions: all fire inspection deficiencies rectified, including removal of all combustible and waste materials in and around buildings and annual testing and maintenance of portable fire extinguishers; that the site be cleared of all uninsured vehicles and vehicle parts, and other miscellaneous debris; and that the owner advise tenants that automotive business use is not permitted on the property and to ensure that this is enforced. The bylaw amendment will be subject to public consultation by way of a Public Hearing.

W.E. GRAHAM COMMUNITY SCHOOL **REGISTRATION** ------ 2024/2025 ------

Great things are happening at W.E.Graham Community School. We are now accepting registrations for all students in grades Kindergarten through 10 including applications for the Valhalla Wilderness Program for Grades 9 & 10. W.E. Graham endeavours to engage students through a wide variety of outdoor and experiential opportunities.

Primary Outdoor Program (POP): spends at least two afternoons a week exploring the local environment and is actively involved in the use of an outdoor classroom area on the Slocan River. You may have seen them out in the community with their fancy backpacks! It's time to register for Kindergarten now! Our Intermediate Class (WILD): is a multi-aged community focused classroom that is based on character and leadership development. This class calls themselves **WILD** (Wilderness Intermediate Leadership Development)! Outdoor Environmental Leadership Program (OELP): Grades 7 -8's have the opportunity in which to combine experiential activities, and core academics to create a program that fosters leadership, resilience, self-confidence, and awareness of the outdoors. The program offers, cooking, photography, technology, robotics, art, and many day trips and a few overnight trips. The Valhalla Wilderness Program (VWP) is a one of a kind junior (Grade 9 and 10 only) wilderness program that has achieved an international reputation for excellence. This program focuses on creating a learning experience which involves backcountry skiing, mountain biking, hiking and canoeing. Students receive certificates in avalanche awareness as well as first aid. This program involves 5 to 6 extended out trips as well as day trips every Friday. In conjunction with the outdoor experience, the students are also in class for a regular selection of academic classes and integrated curriculum experiences. Spaces in this program are limited and an application process is required in addition to a regular registration form. If you are not in the W.E. Graham catchment area, it is important that you complete a school transfer very soon. We will be hosting a Kindergarten Orientation in June. Check in with the school for date.
