



VILLAGE OF SLOCAN NOTES – October 2025

- John Gates, Slocan Legion, attended the meeting to share information about the Commemorative Crosswalk Project and staff will be contacting the Legion for more information.
- Amy Clarke, ARC Engagement, attended the meeting to provide an overview of the Waterfront Commons "What We Heard Report". The Report has been posted on our website News page, with a link to the Waterfront Commons Website.
- Council granted approval for locating and cutting a tree to place on the Wellness Centre grounds for the Annual Christmas Tree Light Up Celebration. Public Works will assist with the labour and equipment; and the Wellness Center will be available to use for power, washrooms, and hallway space.
- The Slocan Valley Outriders Association's License to occupy Village-owned land located at 901 Arlington Road, be renewed for the purpose of providing equestrian riding grounds and activities, for a further term of five years, expiring March 1st, 2030.
- Council approved the RDCK to apply for, receive, and manage the UBCM Community Emergency Preparedness Fund (CEPF) ESS Equipment and Training regional grant funding on behalf of the Village of Slocan.
- Council approved the Development Permit Amendment for the proposed Affordable Housing Project located at 903 Hume St (Lot 1-4, 17-20 Block 34, DL 292, KDP Plan 496) as presented.
- The Tennis Court tiles are being investigated to fix.
- A letter of concern will be drafted to the Interior Health Authority outlining the concerns of residents regarding the proposed All-Around Septic installation up Springer Creek Road.
- Following the Interfor meeting on October 15, 2025, in Slocan, a letter will be drafted to Interfor, expressing the concerns of community members over the proposed cut block on Springer Creek.
- Joyce Johnson gave a brief update on the Merriwake project; with the foundation to be complete by the end of October or early November, construction to finish in the Spring and the boat to be installed June 1st, 2026.
- Council resolved to strike a Legion Building Committee of Council. The draft Legion Building Committee Terms of Reference were approved as presented. Mayor Jessica Lunn and Councillor Madeleine Perriere be appointed as Council representatives and Council appointed Cliff Froehlich, Neil Turkington and Eunice Ludlow to the Legion Building Committee.
- Council appointed 7 members to the Halloween Hoot Committee, in addition to Jordan Knott, who was appointed as the Council representative.

SNOW REMOVAL
